







Q1 How often do you use John Nolen Drive? (Including via automobile, bicycle, transit, or as a pedestrian).




Q2 What primary mode of transportation do you use when accessing John Nolen Drive?



Q3 What John Nolen Drive Reconstruction project goals are most important to you? Please rank the project goals below based on their importance to you personally.






Q13 What race/ethnicity best describes you?
